#### Item 4: Presentations by subgroups of the BFA Committee

# (a) Planning & Transport Group (Jill Kingaby)

The report was accepted. JK responded to a question from D Lewis on the time frame for the Vision for Bear Flat, stating it isn't possible to give a precise date for implementation. Progress has been delayed as we wait for the report from WECA on the A 367 Corridor initiative. JK said the focus on Hayes Place would be retail, ensuring local businesses are involved. Low Traffic Neighbourhoods, LTN, are being considered by BANES. JK also said the Government was reviewing their Neighbourhood Plan Statement

Diana Francis thanked the association for the work done on this, asking that we remain realistic on what the council could afford

## (b) Membership (Jeremy Trenchard )

The report was accepted. JT confirmed that we had 437 current members with 58 that had expired. JT stated that there was a need to expand the membership and asked that everyone thought about how we could make the Association appeal to a broader base of interests.

c) Food Group

d)Friends of Bloomfield Green (Clyde Hunter)

The report was accepted

CH confirmed that next years 'Gathering on the Green' would be on the 11 th June 2023

CH responded to a question from Sue Evans confirming that a Cedar of Lebanon would be planted as part of the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations

e) Friends of Alexandra Park (Jeremy Trenchard)

D Fenton expressed his concern at the proliferation of signage in the park and at the recent installation of concrete kerbs.
